Printmaking
Northumberland, PA

Artist's Biography
Marilyn Paul is a fine art printmaker specializing in works utilizing calligraph, etching and monotype techniques. An award winning artist and teacher, she is a graduate of Indiana University of Pennsylvania with a degree in Art Education and Bloomsburg University with a Master's Degree in Printmaking. Now retired, Marilyn taught art at Milton Area Senior High School for 32 years. She is president of the Susquehanna Art Society. Her artwork has been selected into juried shows and has been featured in solo and group exhibitions. Marilyn creates her prints on a press in her home studio in Northumberland, PA. Her prints are limited to small variable editions of five plus an artist's proof.

Artist's Statement
My hand pulled prints explore the joy and inspiration found in nature. Layered colors, textures and patterns are characteristic of my prints. I construct printing plates of various materials that fit together and overlap. I collect and dry natural materials which may be incorporated into the images. Textures are an important component in my work and are enhanced by printing through handmade papers, pieces of crocheted lace, and found materials. My prints are built up in repeated passes through the press combining numerous printing techniques within each work.


