HISTORIC TALK



"The Tiniest Mansion in Williamsport"

Built by the celebrated carpenter-stair builder, William Slack, circa 1890, this house is a recreation of all of the lovely features and the layout of the Hermance Mansion, only much smaller. Besides building the Hermance staircase, Mr. Slack also built the staircase in the former Mulberry Street M.E. Parsonage (also on tour this year), the James. V. Brown mansion, the mansions at 829 and 1022 West Fourth Street, the Rawley mansion, the Updegraff Hotel and many more. While this house is not the size of a mansion, the interior appears much larger than it actually is due to the optical illusions Slack created using his woodworking skills. The home has been cared for and kept in its original condition by the Potts family for over 42 years.



THE TOUR



Williamsport Enchanted Sight Foundation Museum • 345 Mulberry Street (Home of Marguerite Bierman and Norman Wengert)

Built in the 1870's, this three-story brick home previously served as a Methodist ministers' parsonage. Starting in the 1990's, it became Dr. Norman Wengert's practice of chiropractic and Marguerite Bierman's studio for decorative and fine arts. Marguerite and Norman rejuvenated the building to showcase Marguerite's talents, her artistic and personal collaboration with Norman, and the contributions of many local artisans. Pieces from an eclectic mix of time periods and styles fill the space. It houses the Enchanted Sight Foundation, initiated by Norman and Marguerite, so their love for personal evolution through deep feeling, color and creativity could inspire others.

Jackass Brewing Company • 301 West Third Street

New this year is the historically restored Jackass Brewing Company. The original brick walls and hardwood floors of this former warehouse have been carefully preserved and restored, bringing warmth and character to every level of the building. There's a charming antique scale built into the brew room floor that still works, and an old-school freight elevator in the center of the building that is perfect for transporting heavy sacks of grains and deliciously cold kegs of craft beer.

Enjoy lunch at Jackass Brewery, Victorian tea at the Peter Herdic House and Restaurant, or Sax, Soup and Salad at The Old Corner Hotel and Restaurant.
