Hundred Dresses Project by Crystal Cawley

Join us for an Artist Reception on Thursday, June 6th, 4:30 - 6:30 p.m. A gallery talk will be held at 5:30 p.m. "The Hundred Dresses Project: We Are All In This Together" was inspired by Eleanor Estes' classic children's book, *The Hundred Dresses*, a story of an immigrant schoolgirl who is teased by her classmates for her accent, name, clothes, and her family's poverty. The book explores themes of acceptance, inclusion, art, empathy, and finding the courage to stand up for what is right. Cawley sent over 150 artists an invitation to read the book and embellish a 14 x 11" letterpress dress print which she created. Through a Pennsylvania Partners in the Arts grant from the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts, The Gallery invited regional 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students, through their school's art educator, to read Estes' book and create 7 x 5" works to add to the exhibit. The show will run through July 23rd.
